Responsibilities of Editorial Board Members

- **Final Manuscript Assessment:** Board Members review manuscripts after editorial screening and provide critical insights on legal reasoning, scholarly contribution, and originality.
- **Decision-Making Role:** Board Members offer clear recommendations on whether to accept, revise, or reject a manuscript. Their input is crucial in the final publication decision.
- **Feedback Contribution:** Even if a manuscript is not selected for publication, Board Members are expected to provide meaningful, respectful feedback that helps authors grow.
- **Timeliness:** Board Members are expected to complete their assessments within 3 days of receiving the manuscript.
- Confidentiality: All manuscripts and discussions during the review process must be handled with strict confidentiality.

Safeguarding Creators Ethical Expectations

- Academic Objectivity: Board Members must evaluate submissions based solely on scholarly quality, without regard to the author's identity, institution, or background.
- Conflict of Interest Disclosure: Any real or perceived conflict of interest whether financial, institutional, or personal, must be disclosed immediately, and the member should recuse themselves from further evaluation of the manuscript.
- Independence: Board Members are expected to uphold the journal's editorial independence and to make decisions free from commercial or political influence.
