Retractions and Corrections Policy

IPVarna Law Review is committed to maintaining the accuracy, reliability, and integrity of the scholarly record. To this end, we have established clear procedures for correcting errors or retracting published work when necessary.

Correction of Published Articles

If any factual, typographical, or formatting errors are identified post-publication, either by the editorial team or brought to our attention by readers or authors, we will review the issue promptly. Where such errors do not materially affect the substance, argument, or legal analysis of the article, a corrected version may be issued without a public notice. In all cases, the author(s) will be notified of the change and consulted if needed. Minor corrections may be made directly to the published version at the discretion of the editorial team.

Retraction of Articles

A manuscript may be retracted if it is found to involve serious issues such as plagiarism, data fabrication, ethical misconduct, duplicate publication, or legal misrepresentation. Upon receiving credible information regarding such concerns, the editorial board will conduct a formal review and make a decision within seven days.

In such cases, the author(s) will be notified in writing, with reasons for the retraction and the basis of the decision. While IPVarna Law Review reserves the

right to issue a formal retraction notice, we generally prioritize author communication and internal resolution unless a public statement is deemed essential for academic or legal clarity.

Notification and Confidential Handling

All retraction and correction procedures are conducted with transparency toward the author(s) while maintaining discretion in public communications. The journal will not issue public notices of corrections or retractions unless the editorial board determines that it is absolutely necessary for legal accuracy, scholarly transparency, or indexing compliance. In every case, the author(s) will be informed of any editorial decisions or actions taken.
